



social science research -

- Developing effective partnerships between DOC and community groups
- Effective techniques for sharing scientific skills and knowledge to strengthen community capacity
- Contribution that voluntary groups add to conservation work including time/financial

Features of effective groups

- Strong leadership
- Community commitment
- Group stability
- Skills and knowledge on committees
- Clear vision, goal, project plan
- Security of funding
- Legal structure & business approach
- Internal communication

Other Issues for groups


 Groups lacking iconic species can struggle to compete for funds

 Tensions may arise when leaders make decisions without community or when new members introduce different ideas and goals



Issues for DOC: partnership/empowerment role

- Staff continuity
- Appropriateness of staff style
- Consistency of support
- Level of bureaucracy
- Definition of DOCs role
- Regular communication
- Careful planning
- Importance of collaborative learning
- Group management techniques
- Monitoring/evaluation/feedback




Tools
